Dedicated Love and Care in 2022

In 2022, our volunteers, with unwavering love and care, actively advanced all of Tzu Chi USA's missions, as our services had fully resumed since the disruptions caused by the COVID-19 pandemic, and our aid and the number of individuals and families benefiting increased.

With vigilant attention to the underprivileged and underserved in our communities, our 2022 food distributions, offered in collaboration with food banks and school districts, relieved 137,416 households, comprising 295,257 individuals. At the same time, 396 distributions brought hot meals to 29,187 individuals across the United States.

When the cold of winter descended, our volunteers were ready to help with additional assistance, providing \$59,827 in cash cards, eco-blankets, and more, which reached 4,400 households. In 2022, we also distributed \$407,640 to individual care case recipients.

Since Tzu Chi values the next generation, our Happy Campus program served 14,293 disadvantaged students who received food packs, school supplies, or tutoring. Our need-based scholarship awards totaled \$156,000 in 2022, assisting underprivileged college-bound high school graduates and returning undergraduates.

Our medical mission had ten mobile clinics on the road, providing 10,096 services in 2022, including medical, vision, and dental care. At the same time, 79 domestic medical outreach events nationwide helped local residents obtain much-needed treatments and free medication.

The year was not free from disasters, as few are with the progression of climate change. Tzu Chi volunteers ventured near and far across the nation to assist survivors of wildfires, floods, storms, and tornadoes, providing \$3,399,073 in relief to 12,383 individuals struggling to recover.

Tzu Chi delegations participated in international gatherings, advocating for environmental protection, vegetarianism, interfaith collaboration, compassion, and service to others in addressing world problems. We organized and held the Holistic Climate Solutions Summit as part of Climate Week NYC 2022 and launched the program *United in Action: Dialogue at Tzu Chi Center* to explore United Nations and Tzu Chi mission topics.

Steadfastly, Tzu Chi USA's elementary school, four preschools, and 25-weekend academies delivered quality education. Our character education program touched students in American and international schools, even reaching Ukrainian children sheltering in Poland after escaping war in their homeland.

Tzu Chi Education teachers and students in the U.S. and internationally also encouraged 10,700 students across 42 schools to participate in the Great Kindness Challenge to promote kindness for all sentient beings. And our Humanistic Education Department's new Life Science Garden in California welcomed 5,098 visitors.

Our volunteers' earnest efforts in all our missions filled 2022, yet they would not be possible without your support and partnership in the cause of relieving suffering and empowering those in need. Thank you from the depth of our hearts, and may we continue to work together going forward, making this world a better place for all.

ABOUT TZU CHI USA



The Buddhist Tzu Chi Foundation is a volunteer-based international non-governmental organization established by Dharma Master Cheng Yen in Hualien, Taiwan, in 1966. From 30 housewives saving 50 NT cents (approx. 2 US cents) from their grocery budget per day to help those in need, Tzu Chi's footprints of humanitarian aid have now reached 128 countries and regions. The Foundation provides community and social services, national and international disaster relief, medical and charitable assistance, education, environmental protection, and a bone marrow donor registry while promoting humanistic values and community volunteerism.

Tzu Chi USA, the Foundation's first chapter outside Taiwan, was established in Alhambra, CA, in 1989. Stephen Huang, an American businessman, had visited Master Cheng Yen in Hualien, and meeting this gentle nun, who created a powerful organization and realized seemingly impossible dreams, all for the benefit of others, changed his life. He became a disciple and vowed to bring the spirit and mission of Tzu Chi to the United States. Today, Tzu Chi USA has 65 offices and facilities nationwide, with volunteers and donors striving to make a difference in their communities, serving others unconditionally, and sowing seeds of love and kindness in the Americas.

CHARITY

Tzu Chi USA helps families in need in the United States annually, our charitable services encompassing short, mid, and long-term support. The assistance provided includes aid for individual charity cases; the provision of hot meals; winter care distributions; scholarships; Happy Campus programs for underprivileged students and their families; mobile and permanent food pantries; and free tax filing services for qualifying families. Among them, some families have been cared for continuously for more than a decade.







FOOD DISTRIBUTION

One in eight people struggles with hunger in the United States due to poverty or unexpected situations that can force families to suddenly choose between buying food or paying bills. We partnered with food banks and school districts to offer food pantry services nationwide, focusing on underprivileged and underserved communities, families, and groups, thus helping those suffering due to poverty, hunger, or homelessness.

Our programs in 2022 helped families in need across America, benefiting over 137,000 households.

HOT MEAL DISTRIBUTION

In 2022, **29,187** individuals in the United States benefited from **396** distributions of hot meals by **1,592** volunteer counts.





COMMUNITY CARE SERVICES

In 2022, Tzu Chi volunteers conducted 450 visits to public housing communities and shelters for those experiencing homelessness or recovering from mental health challenges. They distributed personal care and hygiene products, socks, and gifts.

CHARITY CARE CASES

Any number of factors can suddenly plunge a household into tough economic circumstances, including loss of employment, illness, family troubles, or a disaster. Regardless of the cause, volunteers pay personal visits to families in need to understand their particular circumstances and determine the scope* of financial relief required.

In 2022, **\$407,640**** was distributed to short-term or mid to long-term care recipients by 19,493 volunteer counts and visits, benefiting 6,611 households, comprising 12,853 individuals.

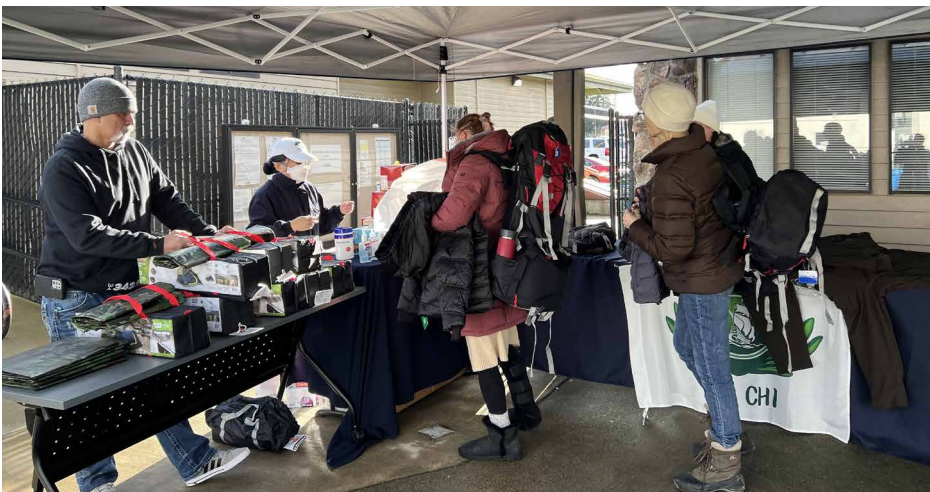

HAPPY CAMPUS PROGRAMS

All students deserve an excellent education, which thrives with solid community support. Tzu Chi USA established the Happy Campus Program to provide such support for underprivileged students. Day after day, students in need receive tutoring, healthy meals, school supplies, uniforms, and mentoring services, all provided by Tzu Chi volunteers with genuine smiles and infectious enthusiasm.

In 2022, **14,293** students benefited from food packs, school supplies, or tutoring through **7,301** volunteer counts across the nation.





WINTER DISTRIBUTIONS

As each year marches into the winter season, Tzu Chi volunteers begin their annual winter care program, providing love and support by distributing essential supplies in communities, schools, and low-income households. During the 2022 winter season, over 7,000 individuals received cash cards, eco blankets, and more.

VITA

(VOLUNTEER INCOME TAX ASSISTANCE)

Tzu Chi volunteers certified by the IRS sponsored VITA program provided free federal and state income tax return filing assistance to taxpayers with an income of \$60,000 or less, at five regional branch offices across the nation.

During the 2022 tax season, a total of 1,804 individuals successfully filed their income tax returns through Tzu Chi USA's VITA service.

**The number of individuals benefiting from VITA before national or state COVID-19 lockdown measures that began in April*

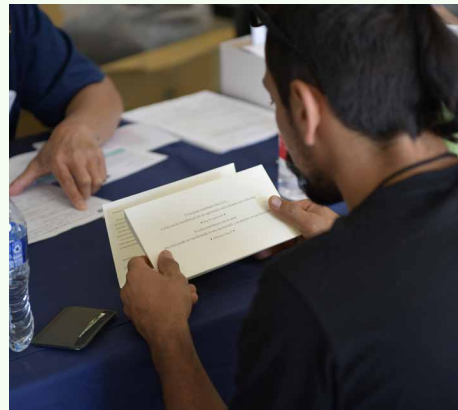
DISASTER RELIEF

Natural disasters leave death and destruction in their wake. However, Tzu Chi volunteers follow quickly behind, bringing compassionate care to those impacted by providing cash cards, eco-blankets, and daily necessities to help survivors through the initial period of grief and uncertainty.

In 2022, Tzu Chi brought relief and urgent assistance to survivors of natural disasters, including fires, floods, storms, and tornadoes, by providing \$3,399,073 in aid, benefiting 2,692 families comprising 12,383 individuals. Tzu Chi volunteers also distributed over 3,000 bamboo banks, hoping to inspire giving to help others in their time of need.

However, that's only the beginning. Tzu Chi volunteers know disaster survivors need someone to accompany them on the long road to full recovery. Even in 2022, aid for those affected by the 2018 Camp Fire in California continues.

MEDICAL OUTREACH

We provide free medical, dental, and vision care for those in need in the United States and internationally. These healthcare services are offered by medical professionals and logistical volunteers from Tzu Chi International Medical Association (TIMA).

In 2022, a total of 79 domestic medical outreach events were organized nationwide for local residents to obtain much-needed treatments and free medication for those who can't afford them. This outreach was successful due to the support of local partners, 622 medical professionals, and 1,763 general volunteers.





To meet the growing needs of uninsured and underinsured residents, weekly or biweekly small-scale outreach events offering one service type, or mobile clinic visits, were also arranged to provide further follow-up care.

MOBILE OUTREACH

Tzu Chi's ten mobile clinics offer comprehensive medical, dental, vision, and cancer screening services to patients without insurance or access to ongoing health care, most of whom have a family income below 200% of the federal poverty level. A total of four dental, four vision, one medical, and one prostate cancer screening mobile clinics serve migrant farmworkers, individuals experiencing homelessness, low-income households, uninsured students, and others with barriers to medical care across California.

Through the See 2 Succeed project, children from low-income families in Fresno receive free vision care and glasses. Tzu Chi's mobile vision care outreach also serves New York and Las Vegas. In 2022, at the Federal Emergency Management Agency's invitation, we also provided free dental clinic services to Afghan refugees settling in Los Angeles.

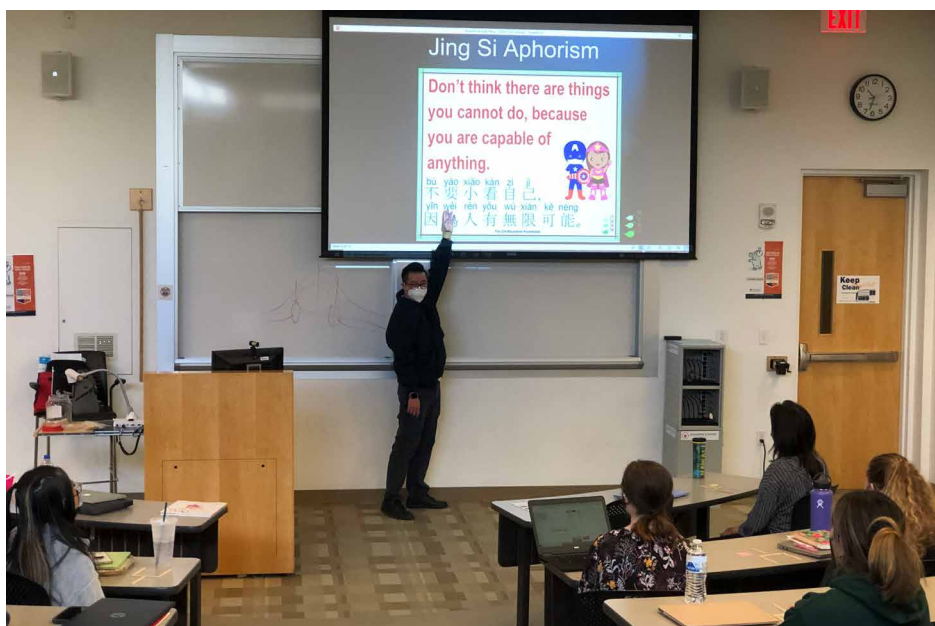
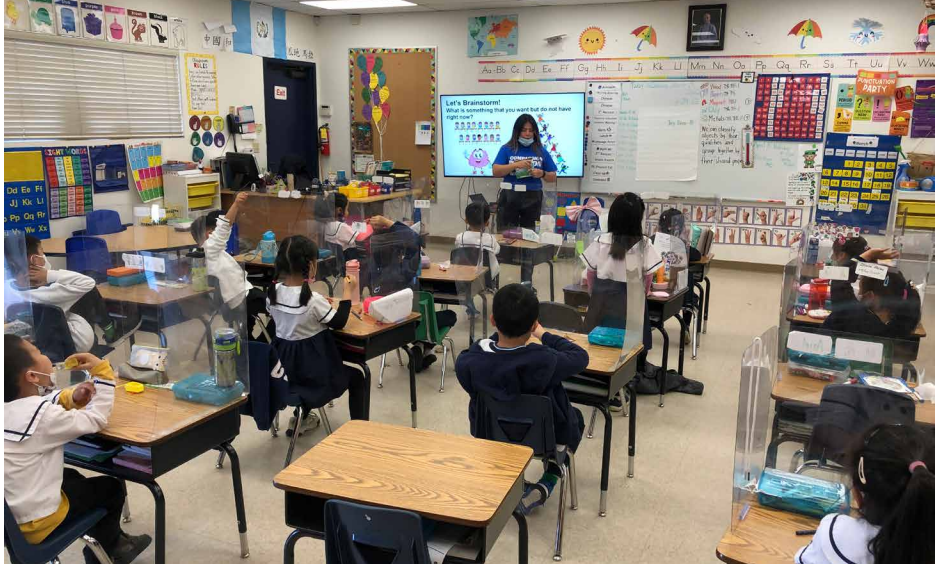

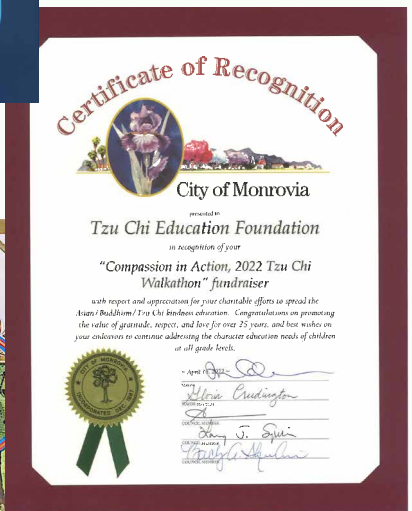

TZU CHI ACADEMIES

Setting themselves apart from other weekend Chinese schools, Tzu Chi Academies not only instruct students in Chinese language and culture, but also focus on character development with frequent opportunities to do good deeds. The first school opened in 1994; there are now 25 Academies spread across 14 states, as well as Junior Academies and Children's Learning Classes. Each school gives students a weekly opportunity to nurture their hearts and minds while developing kindness, compassion, joy and giving.

INSPIRATION FOR INMATES

The wise words of Tzu Chi's founder, Dharma Master Cheng Yen, especially as collected in *Jing Si Aphorisms*,* have long provided inspiration and guidance to countless people around the world. As prison and jail inmates are in especially great need of companionship and encouragement, volunteers expanded Tzu Chi's inmate support programs to begin a nationwide book donation and pen pal program in late 2013.

As of the end of 2022, 618 inmates from 39 states are part of Tzu Chi's correspondence program. Some inmates have also joined the cycle of benefiting and giving by donating funds or stamps toward Tzu Chi's missions.

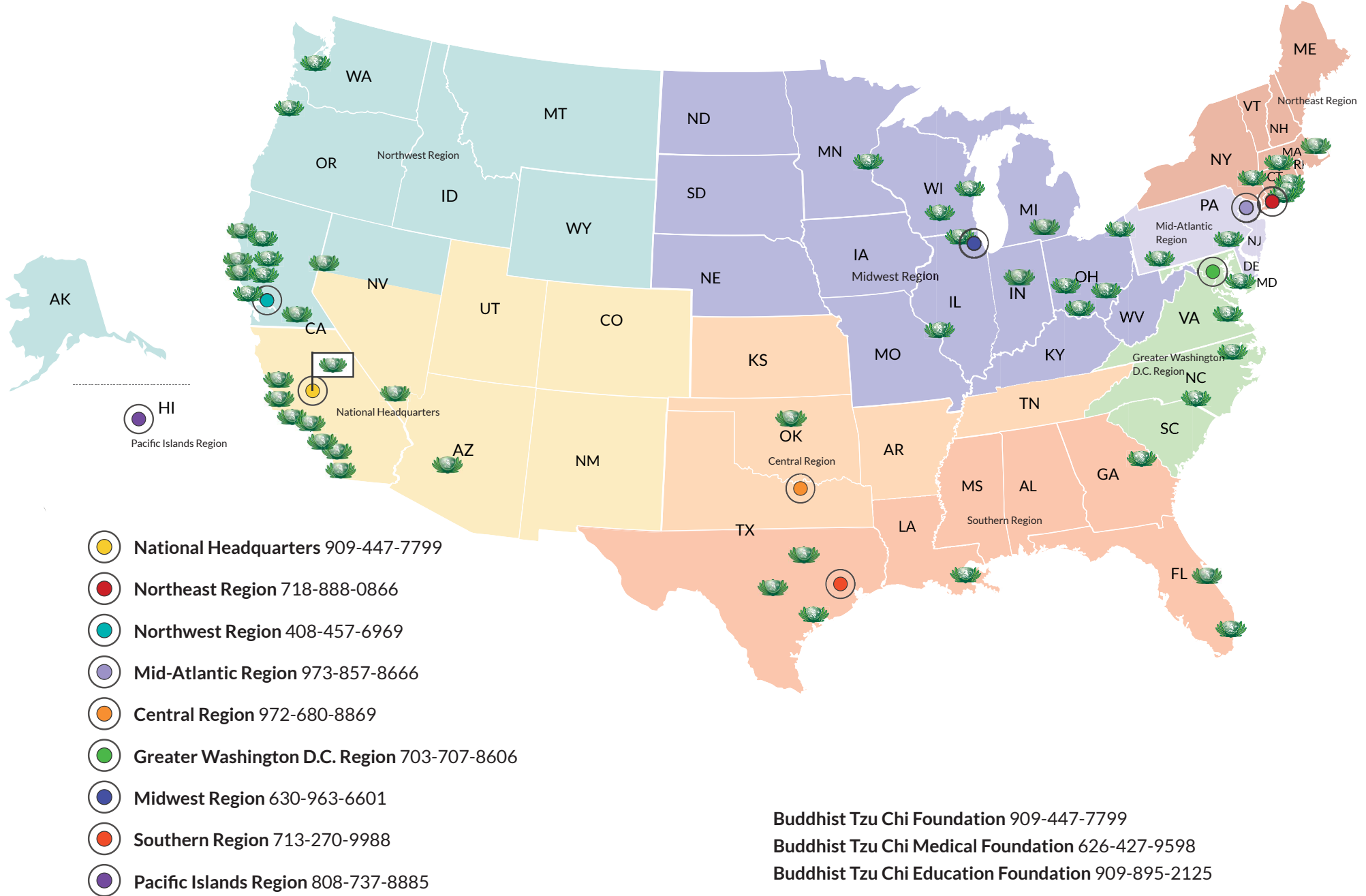
