Ongoing Relief Efforts

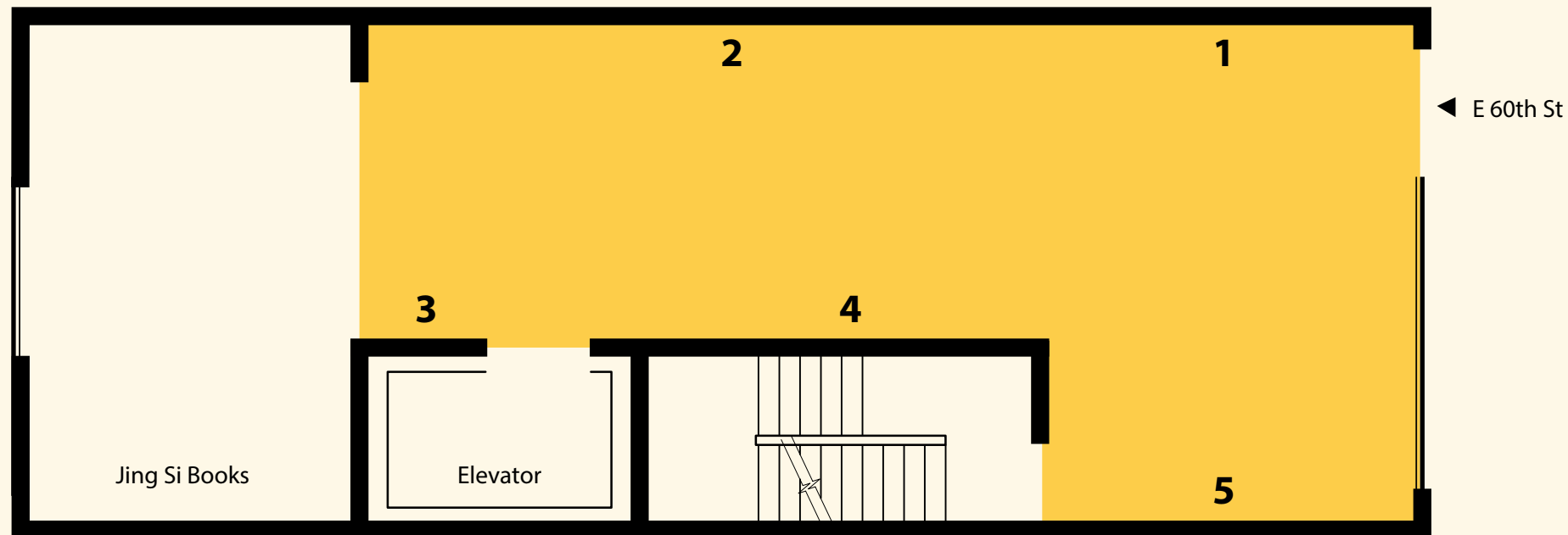

Relief Efforts for Ukrainians and Syrians

According to the United Nations Refugee Agency, 1 in every 78 people has been forced to flee their homes due to war, conflict, famine, and more.

On the exhibition's first floor, **Uprooted** presents the story of Ukrainians escaping their homeland since the Russia-Ukraine war began in 2022. Discover Tzu Chi's aid in **Europe** and how partnerships reinforce the international relief effort.

After the civil war erupted in Syria in 2011, it also created an exodus of people. See how Tzu Chi is assisting Syrians who found refuge in **Jordan**. Tzu Chi's support also reached refugees from Syria and other countries stranded in **Serbia**.

On the first floor, you can explore the **Timeline** highlighting Tzu Chi's assistance for refugees in many countries from 1979-2023.

The Buddhist Tzu Chi Foundation is a global non-profit humanitarian organization founded in 1966 by a Buddhist nun named Dharma Master Cheng Yen. Its missions of medicine, charity, education, and humanistic culture have brought relief to 128 countries and counting. In 1989, Tzu Chi USA was established and now has 65 offices across the United States. The heart of Tzu Chi is embedded in its name: In Chinese, "tzu" means compassion, and "chi," relief.
